

1793

April:

Morgan's Station- Nineteen women and Children were captured by Native Americans. Settlers went after the group overtaking them. Captives were taken back, but not before some were killed.

April and May:

Morgan's station- Lieut. William McMulens and twenty six men from Lexington and Fayette County were sent as guards for the iron works on Slate Creek, due to attacks by members of the Wyandotte tribe.

November 1- Native Americans attack a mere four miles from where the work men were building the state house, and a guard of soldiers was sent to protect them.

Early May:

Native Americans fired on three men near Fort Hamilton, and wounded one of them. Then a party of Natives stole two horses from Morgan's Station.
